

Goals

Understand how scanning habits and tools differ across work environments


- Scanning habits include scanning in front of others and back-office scanning, as well as frequency and volume of scanning
- Tools include scanner software and hardware

Identify any preferences and/or natural propensities

Methods

- Used SurveyMonkey Audience to field the survey
- Solicited responses from 2,868 individuals
- 1,460 eligible respondents who scan frequently at work
- Ages 22 to 65

Hypotheses

Hypothesis 1:

People who scan in the presence of others are:

- More likely to use desktop scanners
- Scan smaller batches at high volume

Hypothesis 2:

People who scan in the absence of others are:


- More likely to use office scanners
- Scan large batches at low volume

Hypothesis 3:

Employees scan to:


- ✓ Keep record/file
- Populate an automated workflow
- Make documents actionable

Our survey respondents fell into 3 key groups



44.68%

Hypothesis 1: Scanning in the presence of others



Discovery

The minority of respondents (44.68%) scan in the presence of clients/other people.

This group was more likely to use a desktop scanner and scan a small set of documents at a higher volume compared to all other groups.




Employees who scan in the presence of others...

Scan a small volume of documents at a time



63.94% compared to 63.27% who scan in the absence of others

Scan multiple times a day



57.57% compared to 47.42% who scan in the absence of others

Use a desktop scanner




26.42% compared to 22.82% who scan in the absence of others


Hypothesis 2: Scanning in the absence of others

Discovery

The majority of respondents (82.79%) scan alone or in a back-office setting.

Employees who scan in the absence of others...

Use an office scanner



59.80% compared to 57.08% who scan in the presence of others

Scan once a day or once a week



46.24% compared to 37.28% who scan in the presence of others

(n=1,421)

Scan a large set of documents at once



35.11% compared to 34.49% who scan in the presence of others

Hypothesis 3: Reasons employees scan

Discovery

Recordkeeping and organizing scanned files are the main motivations for scanning among employees across the board.

However, workflows don't appear to be commonly defined--only 14.24% of respondents have a workflow that automatically organizes scanned files for them.



When saving scanned documents, respondents...

Have a workflow that automatically organizes scanned files for them









Employees who scan both in the presence and absence of others

Discovery


Data indicates that this group's scanning behavior is heavily influenced by their workplace environment.

Their scanning habits are primarily related to working in a shared space or sharing a scanner with others.



Compared to the entire survey population, this group...

Shares an office scanner with others



91.94% compared to 89.89% of client facing employees

Scans in front of others because they scan in a shared space



59.80% compared to 52.31% of all survey respondents


Scans by themselves because the documents don't require any input



56.08% compared to 46.87% of client facing employees



Breakdown by industry



Is scanning a female dominated activity?

- 59.42% of respondents that scan frequently at work identify as female
- However, when comparing male and female responses, workplace preferences or habits do not diverge based on gender





Respondents scan documents in the presence of others because they...

Have to use a scanner in a shared space and are not interacting with that person



52.31%

Are receiving new documents from that person



42.13%

Require a signature from that person before scanning the document



38.43%

Respondents scan in the absence of others because...

They wait to have access to a scanner or to scan multiple documents at once



67.56%

The documents don't require anyone else's input



46.87%

They have access to a personal scanner



31.67%

(n=1,421)



15.17% of all respondents scan documents using a phone or tablet

Picture with app or tablet



9.44% of all respondents

Scanning app on phone or tablet



6.72% of all respondents

This behavior was more common when scanning in the presence of others



17.32% Compared to 15.17% of all respondents
